Visit the Mary E. Wrinch Art Exhibit until January 31st the Leaside Library

Mary E. Wrinch (1877—1969)

The East York Foundation maintains a large collection of art from noted Canadian artists. We seek opportunities to exhibit some of these works for the public to enjoy. From January 4 – 31 we are proud to feature oil paintings, colour block prints and lino block prints by Mary E. Wrinch, an accomplished Canadian painter and printmaker. When she first emigrated in 1885 from England with her family, Wrinch enrolled at Bishop Strachan School, later becoming the Art Director for 35 years. Throughout her career, Wrinch experimented with water and sky in motion, often applying shades of blue and purple. Many of Wrinch's prints include flowers and wildflowers always portrayed frontally, filling the picture as seen in Darwin Tulips, 1932. At age 45, Wrinch married oil painter George A. Reid. They resided at Upland Cottage in Wychwood Park which was considered an artists' colony, a permanent sketching ground for students at the Ontario Central School of Art and Design (now OCAD). After Reid's death in 1947, Wrinch continued her printmaking, creating florals and landscapes. She resided at Upland Cottage until her death in 1969 at age 91.

Meeting was called to order at 7:38pm by EYHS President Jane Pitfield;

Annual Report: President Jane Pitfield reviewed the accomplishments that were noted in the President's Report, which was included in the November 2013 newsletter.
