WE REMEMBER RAYMOND HARRY BALL

BALL, Raymond Harry - October 13, 1929 – March 6, 2019

Fr. Ball died on Wednesday, March 6, 2019, at the age of 89. His devotion and his firm belief in God supported him throughout his life and ultimately gave him peace.

He was predeceased by his parents Anne and George Ball and his sisters Audrey (Bill), Lorraine (John) and Barbara. A graduate of Trinity College (University of Toronto), Raymond travelled the world and had many pastoral charges, including in Saskatchewan, Guyana, the Bahamas and finally South Africa.

Following his return to Canada, he became a member of the Kitchener-Waterloo Ordinariate community (The Sodality of St. Edmund, King and Martyr) and then a member of the Toronto Ordinariate community (The Catholic Parish of St. Thomas More). Father was well known for his generous spirit and eagerness to share

stories from his travels abroad. Even in his later years, he enjoyed exploring new places, spending time with friends and family and was always willing to extend a helping hand to those in need.

Family and friends express our gratitude to the staff at Alexis Lodge in Toronto for their compassion and excellent care provided to Father in his final months. A Requiem Mass will be celebrated by Father John Hodgins (the priest-administrator of St. Thomas More) at 11:00 a.m., Wednesday, March 20th at **St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church**, 263 Roncesvalles Ave. in Toronto.



EGLINTON CROSTOWN LIGHTWEIGHT TRANSIT PROJECT

Metrolinx is building the Eglinton Crosstown, Toronto's new 19-kilometre light rail transit (LRT) line that will run along Eglinton Avenue with a central 10 km underground section. The Crosstown will connect Mount Dennis in the west to Kennedy Road in the east, and the new service will be up to 60% faster than the bus service today. With 25 stations and stops and connections to 3 TTC subway stations, 54 local bus routes, 3 GO Transit lines and the UP Express, the Crosstown will improve travel times and change the way we move through the heart of the city.

Glenn was born and raised in a small Lake Huron shore town and recalls seeing many Royal Air Force training Planes during the War years. Kincardine was a favourite town for all the English Flyers in Canada, training to fly and bomb. His Mother worked in a factory during the War making wings for the Mosquito Bombers. These events may have helped Glenn decide to join the Royal Canadian Air Force upon graduation from High School. The Air Force at that time was attempting to rapidly expand due to the ever-expanding Cold War.

Glenn is going to give a brief history of what was going on during his service as a Fighter Pilot. Glenn and Connie Fenton are long time members in good standing with the East York Historical Society.

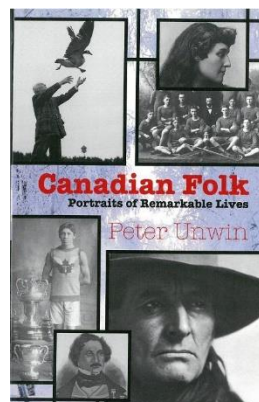
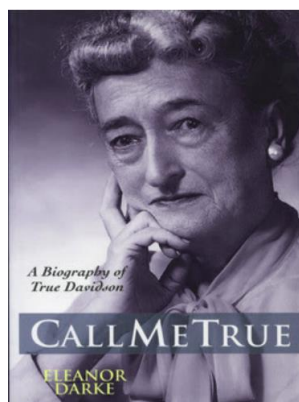
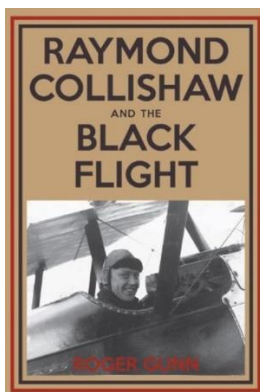

LIFE LEASE APARTMENTS IN EAST YORK

The late Edna Beange, a former Borough of East York Councillor and member of the East York Historical Society was a champion on behalf of seniors. She helped to establish East York Meals on Wheels and was a pioneer in the development of two Life Lease Apartment Buildings for seniors.

The Life Lease is a legal agreement that lies between renting and owning a home. It provides one with the exclusive right to occupy an apartment for your lifetime or until you are no longer capable of living independently. Like a condominium you must purchase a Life Lease but unlike a condominium which is built by a private developer to make a profit, a Life Lease apartment is built by a non-profit corporation with a view to providing housing for seniors at a price as affordable as construction costs will allow.

HOWARD TALBOT, By Hon. Alan Redway

Most of us are familiar with the Leaside Property Owners Association's recent successful battle to save the Talbot apartments from the redevelopment plans of the present owner, the Manitoba Teacher's Pension Fund. But do you know who Talbot was?

Howard Talbot was the Mayor of the former town of Leaside for ten years from 1938 to 1947. During that time the community changed from a small company town dominated by Canada Wire and Cable to a thriving Toronto suburb. This was the period when Leaside experienced much of its growth and began to take on its present physical character.

Although he was born in England, Henry Howard Talbot grew up in Galt, Ontario. A carpenter by trade, he started his own construction business. Then in 1928 he bought land in Leaside and began building homes on Donegal, Cameron, Bessborough and Parkhurst. The row of duplexes north of Parkhurst on the east side of Bayview south of Eglinton were all built by Howard Talbot. But his largest project was the low rise apartment complex on Bayview south of McRae and north of Sutherland known to long time Leasiders as the Talbot apartments.

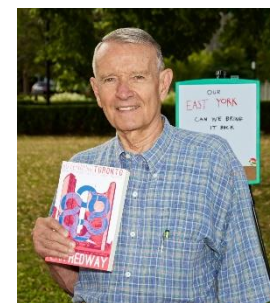
Today we would call Howard Talbot a developer. Not many developers hold public office these days. But in 1936 Mr. Talbot was elected to Leaside Council and two years later he became Mayor.

Many people feel that the best interests of developers are often contrary to the best interests of communities where they build. Especially redevelopers who do not live in the community and thus do not have to live with the results of



There are two Life Lease buildings within the boundaries of the former Borough and a third just over the border. The original Life Lease building, Suomi- Koti, on Eglinton, was built by the Finnish Canadian community. It was developed on the original Life Lease concept that ownership remains with the non-profit corporation to which it reverts on the occupants' death. It is then resold to another at a below market price, thus maintaining it as affordable seniors housing.

Unlike Suomi -Koti, the other two, Stay At Home In Leaside (SAHIL) on Bayview and Bethel Green on Millwood (Edna Beange played an important role in the development of both) the occupant is able to sell their Life Lease for what the market will bear.



their own development. In Howard Talbot's day, however, the residents of Leaside looked to their municipal government to provide basic essential services in the most efficient way at the lowest cost to the tax payers. In Talbot they saw a Leaside resident and a large Leaside property owner whose interests in low taxes coincided with their own. He did not disappoint them.

In order to keep taxes at a minimum he stressed the development of the Leaside industrial area. It was through his efforts that a great many industries located in our community during and following WW11. Unfortunately today most are long gone. But as a result of Talbot's efforts, Leaside residents for many years enjoyed the lowest tax rate in the Toronto area.

However, physical growth and low taxes were not the only features of his term as Mayor. He also contributed to the quality of community life by arranging for the purchase of the land which now bears his name Howard Talbot Park; by establishing the Leaside Lions Club; and by his early leadership in efforts to build Leaside Memorial Gardens. In addition he helped to build community pride by arranging for the sponsorship during WW11 of both the Canadian Navy Corvette HMCS Leaside and the RCAF Leaside bomber squadron 432 during and by planning the construction of the Leaside Town Hall at the corner of McRae and Randolph.

Howard Talbot was the leader in moulding both the physical and the social character of our community. We must all do our part in preserving and improving it.
