Please join me here in the reading of our FIRST NATIONS LAND TREATY ACKNOWLEDGEMENT text:

We acknowledge this sacred land on which the East York Historical Society meets. It has been a site of human activity for over 15,000 years. This land is the territory of Haudenshanee, the Huron-Wendat and Petun First Nations, the Seneca and most recently the Mississaugas of the New Credit. This territory was the subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Iroquois Confederacy and the Confederacy of the Ojibwa and allied Nations to peaceably share and care for the resources. Today the meeting place of Toronto is still the home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island and we are grateful to have the opportunity to work in the community on this Territory.



"On the afternoon of October 18, EYHS member Ed Freeman led our discussion group of 28 members on a photo journey to reveal the old and the new of East York. His images compared various East York scenes from yesteryear ago to those with which we are familiar today. His images included aerial photos depicting earlier scenes such as the former Canadian Northern Railway yards which few knew existed down in the Don Valley itself and the new rail yards where Leaside Longo's stands today. Longo's in fact is in one of those railway buildings. Ed is also an experienced geologist with an intimate knowledge of Ontario's rocks and minerals and often leads walks to Toronto's lesser known sites."

Let's Remember and Pay Tribute to Those Who Served... the East York Historical Society, President Pat Barnett and Joyce Crook, were pleased to lay a wreath at the annual East York Remembrance Day Service on November 11, 2017.

The hymn as printed in <u>Songs of Praise</u> (1925) consisted only of the two verses of the 1918 version, credited "Words: Cecil Spring-Rice, 1918; Music: Thaxted", as follows: [9]

I vow to thee, my country, all earthly things above, Entire and whole and perfect, the service of my love; The love that asks no question, the love that stands the test, That lays upon the altar the dearest and the best; The love that never falters, the love that pays the price, The love that makes undaunted the final sacrifice.

And there's another country, I've heard of long ago,
Most dear to them that love her, most great to them that know;
We may not count her armies, we may not see her King;
Her fortress is a faithful heart, her pride is suffering;
And soul by soul and silently her shining bounds increase,
And her ways are ways of gentleness, and all her paths are peace.

I heard my country calling, away across the sea, Across the waste of waters, she calls and calls to me. Her sword is girded at her side, her helmet on her head, And around her feet are lying the dying and the dead; I hear the noise of battle, the thunder of her guns; I haste to thee. my mother. a son among thy sons.

President Pat's Spotlight: Joanne Green (East Yorker)

Joanne Green was born in the west end — Etobicoke just after Hurricane Hazel and has been a EYHS member since 2008 when she moved to East York. Here began her family history, remembering that her grandmother, Elsie Wild, had lived in Todmorden after immigrating from England, according to an old post card she possessed, but never knew exactly where that was, but a clue had always been on the old smokestack she saw going up the Don Valley.

After doing some research, she was trying to find the church where Elsie was married in 1915 and had a chat with EYHS member Joyce Crook who showed her the newspaper clipping of the "Church built in a Day" which was St. Andrew's — where McDonald's is now at Pape and Cosburn. There is a nice big plaque now on the outer wall with the details. Unfortunately, Joanne was not a regular of the double arches or she would have found it sooner, she said.

Joanne has volunteered for many years for the East York Historical Society at the information tents at Todmorden Mills for Doors Open and July 1 Canada Day at Stan Wadlow Park. She produced a new map of the houses of architectural interest of East York and printed out some of the old maps of the area to engage the public at the tables, letting them know that they are available on-line through the Metro Toronto Public Library and encouraging folks to check out the history of their area. Her research skills and knowledge picked up, thanks partly to Ancestry, and also by joining the Toronto Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society and taking courses and historical walks all over the city.

Now retired, Joanne plans to move from her Chisholm Avenue house up to Guelph to further her education in family and local history of both areas, tracking down the first Greens who immigrated to that area in 1830's and then slowly trickled down to the Toronto area too — again to east and west sides of the city. Joanne's other grandmother, Mary Hearn married a trickle-downer, Wesley Green in 1922. A bit of that early family history ties into our November meeting subject.

The Irish Hearn family had a row house on Centre Avenue (site of Hospital for Sick Children) and Mary Hearn, the first child born in Canada (4th of 8), lived in the area now referred to as "The Ward". It is the area

including and north of City Hall that was the first stop for thousands of similar families to get their footing in the "New World". What had started off as a "suburb" of early Toronto called



McCauley Town eventually had every square foot used as rental income for absentee landlords, and became a run-down, overcrowded slum which was removed to build New City Hall and the Hospital for Sick Children.

Mary Pickford (Gladys Louise Smith), the silent screen actress, was born in the Ward in 1892 of Irish stock too, in the Ward at University and Elm St. There is a plaque and a bust of "America's Sweetheart" on the south side of the front entrance to the Hospital for Sick Children to mark her birthplace. When her own house was demolished, she had the bricks sent to her home in California. She used the proceeds of the sale to have a bungalow built in East York, at 90 Glenwood Cres. which was raffled off to benefit war charities in 1943 to the tune of \$250,000. It is on the significant list as the first house built in Woodbine Gardens.

The East York Flag

Shortly after I was elected as the Mayor of East York and therefore a Member of the Metropolitan Toronto Council and Executive Committee, I realized that every one of the six area municipalities which comprised Metropolitan Toronto with the exception of East York had a municipal flag.

So I applied for and received authorization from East York Council to hold a design contest for an East York flag. Now every contest needs a prize but I did not want to burden the taxpayers with the cost so I wrote to each of the industries and businesses in the Borough asking for a modest cash donation of \$200.00 each towards the prize. Peak Freans, Bate Chemical, Canada Wire and Cable, Coca Cola, Dominion Regalia and Seel Enterprizes responded positively.

However one other company sent me a cheque but indicated they thought this was a foolish idea. I promptly sent back their cheque reminding them that this was a matter of civic pride for a very special municipality with an incredible community spirit. Design submissions came from a great many adults but especially from school children some whose teachers took it on as a class project. The winning design was submitted by a Scarborough resident Raymond Taylor who had learned about the contest

from East Yorker Blain Till when

they ran together daily in Taylor Creek Park.

The prize was \$1000.00 for Mr. Taylor and \$100.00 for the winning student design. Thus our flag was a real bargain. On viewing the design a number of East Yorkers expressed the opinion that the "Y" on the flag also represented the two branches of the Don River.

Once the design was approved by Council, Diana (Didy) Erb the wife of the Rector of St. Luke's Anglican Church on Coxwell, the Rev. Canon John Erb made the very first East York flag. Ever after she was known as East York's Betsy Ross. From then on the flag appeared throughout the Borough including prominently on all of our road signs.

Unfortunately in its efforts to ensure we are all Torontonians first, the amalgamated city is replacing our East York street signs with large Toronto blue and white signs. One way we can help to keep the very special community spirit of our Borough alive is by flying the East York flag. The East York Historical Society is selling 4" x 6" East York Flags and will order larger ones if there is sufficient interest.

THE BULLDOG, A SYMBOL OF EAST YORK

The bulldog emblematic of stability, tenacity and fortitude, has long been the symbol of East York. The first official record of the use of the bulldog is in 1962 when the old East York Township, recognising the value of corporate images, decided to use the bulldog on its trucks and letterhead. Also, the Township presented small silver-plated bulldog paperweights to honoured guests.

After amalgamation with the Town of L easide in 1967, the new Borough held a public contest for the design of a new crest. In September 1967, the design by Harry Faulks of Leaside was selected as the Borough's new crest. The design features green maple leaves, a white rose, a brown beaver, a red shield and a bulldog. Before amalgamation Leaside's symbol was the beaver. Mayor True Davidson presented Mr. Faulks with a pair of cuff links as a prize for his winning design.
