Peacefully on Wednesday November 2 (All Soul's Day) at Toronto East General Hospital at 96 and 10 months, six months short of her father's record long life. Daughter of Herald and Rose Pape, "Little" sister of Mary (deceased). What started as a double date with John Stirling Ridout at 16 extended into a loving partnership of 60 years until his death in 2003. In their youth they were campers at "Couch" and members of the AYPA, and would spend hours on the tennis court at St. David's Church. Beloved Mom of "pegilynngaryross"

AKA Pegi, Lynn, Gary and Lori, and Ross and Mahnaz. Devoted and loving Gramma to Nicole, Farbod and Becky, Janet and Dustin, Michelle and Mike, Danielle and Albert, Paul, Chris, Ladan, Renee, and Thomas. Great Gramma to Luca and Julia. Mom was a child of the Depression and left school at 16 to go to work to earn money. She couldn't master shorthand so went into the accounting field as a bookkeeper. Worked at Steele Briggs Seed, Meccano and Canadian Press until her marriage. As she emphasized in some of her last words to us, Education was important to her. OHS Messages - News from the Executive Director

Dear Ontario Historical Society members, volunteers, donors, partners, stakeholders, friends, neighbours, and Ontario History authors and subscribers,

I am writing to inform you of my decision to resign from my position as Executive Director of the Society as soon as the OHS Board of Directors hires my replacement and an appropriate transition period takes place. In the coming weeks this process will begin.

Am I retiring? Never, just moving forward into the next chapter

as this is the right moment for both the OHS and my family.

The 2021 OHS Annual Report shows that the Society has weathered a brutal and historic pandemic with resilience as it continued to broaden its base across Ontario, attracting new members from every part of the province. Ontario History journal continues to thrive, both in print and online.

The digital publication is viewed in over 55 countries around the world, and in 2021 over 84,000 Ontario History articles and book reviews were downloaded (an average of 230 per day).

The 2021 OHS audited financial statements also confirm that the Society's balance sheet is sound, healthy, and debt free with no liabilities.

I am confident that this is indeed the right moment for the Society to move forward with new leadership, which is one of the reasons I feel so confident in my decision. The OHS Board of Directors, responsible for choosing my successor, is one of the strongest, most diverse and talented Boards that I have worked with. And I can't say

enough about the three outstanding and experienced colleagues who have worked with me

as a team for the last seven years and are bringing their best as they continue to move the Society's work forward.

We are in good shape!

I came to the OHS in 1988 after working for many years with environmental and organic agricultural organizations in Canada and overseas. Currently, I am the volunteer President of an environmental organization which is a registered charity. I am deeply concerned and appalled at the escalating assault from so many directions on our natural heritage, resulting in irreplaceable damage and destruction. I cannot remain silent, casually watching this rapidly unfolding ecological nightmare.

I now want to return my focus to this important work. By leaving the OHS, I now will have the necessary time and energy to devote to environmental issues with an independent voice.

My partner Annie has also decided to resign her current position as an Executive Director at IFEX, and together we will live and work from our organic farm and focus our time on these important issues. The fact we also have identical twin grandchildren calling for attention will also ensure we remain extremely busy!

There is no doubt I still passionately love my job and feel very sad indeed that in a few months I will leave an inspiring organization with such a significant mandate. It has been an immense privilege to work alongside such an incredible community of creative, intelligent, committed, diverse, and determined peoples. It is an experience that has taught me so much on so many levels, not only regarding the issues and navigating our work in

challenging circumstances, but also being able to benefit from relationships with members who are so skilled and ingenious in their work defending and promoting the history of Ontario. We have very

thoughtful and dedicated members who are donating their time and expertise for the public benefit and the public interest.

I have learned to listen...a lot. I have learned so much from you.

And everything I have learned from my time with the OHS

will fuel my future work, my life, and my relationships.

What an unforgettable and precious gift you have given me.

I am deeply grateful that I have had the support and friendship of so many OHS members, donors, volunteers, current and former Board Directors and staff, all of whom have been integral to the Society becoming the great organization it is today. Never underestimate the power of our grassroots network and its potential in continuing to be a force to be reckoned with, building civic space where historical activists will use their voices and join with others in doing this vital work. It can only get stronger and I know it will.

In conclusion, it is with mixed feelings of course, but so good to know we will

continue to raise hell where and when we can. It has been and remains an honour and an incredible privilege to have worked on your behalf.

Somehow, I know our paths will continue to cross, let's hope it is soon.

GRIROCHKY

Russian Mushroom Cookies


INGREDIENTS

For the dough:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup corn starch
- pinch of salt
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 stick (8 Tbsp.) butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

For the glaze:

- 1 cup confectioners' sugar, sifted
- 1-2 Tbsp. orange/lemon juice or milk, (more if needed)
- red food coloring (optional)
- confectioners' sugar for dust (optional)
- 4 oz. semisweet or bittersweet chocolate, chopped



2 To make the cookies, over a sheet of waxed paper, sift together the flour, baking powder, corn starch and salt, and set aside.

3 In a large bowl, using an electric mixer on medium speed, beat the butter and sugar until creamy. Add the vanilla, egg and sour cream and continue beating until blended, 1 to 2 minutes more, stopping the mixer occasionally to scrape down the sides of the bowl. Add flour mixture and mix until blended.

4 With floured hands, shape the 1/2 dough into 24 mushroom caps/balls (about 0.7oz each) and place them on the prepared sheets, spacing them about 1 inch apart. Shape the rest of the dough into 24 mushroom stems, (about 0.5oz each). You can put the 'caps' on one sheet and 'stems' on another. I used 4 baking sheets.

5 Bake two sheets at the time, until the cookies are just beginning to brown, about 10-12 minutes, switching the pans and rotating a half turn halfway through baking. Transfer the baking sheets to wire racks and let the cookies cool on the sheets for 5 minutes. Repeat with two more baking sheets.

6 Place the chocolate in the top pan of a double boiler or in a heatproof bowl. Place over but not touching simmering water in the bottom pan. Heat, stirring frequently, until melted and smooth. Remove from the heat.

While the cookies are warm, poke a small hole in the bottom of a mushroom cap. Spread chocolate over the bottom of the cap. Dip the tip of a stem in chocolate, and press lightly into the hole. When the chocolate sets, they will hold together. Repeat with remaining pieces.

8 To make the glaze, in a small bowl, mix together the confectioners' sugar and orange/lemon juice until smooth. Stir in one drop of food coloring at a time until the desired shade is reached. Glaze the mushroom caps with sugar glaze and let it dry.

Dust the cookies with confectioners' sugar shaken through a sieve.





- ½ cup lukewarm water
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 Tbsp. sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- 1 cup butter, softened at room temperature
- ½ cup milk
- 2 eggs, beaten
- Sugar and cinnamon, for rolling (the more the better!)

Instructions



2. In a large bowl, stir together the flour, 3 Tbsp. sugar and salt.

- 3. Add the butter, cutting it in with a fork or pastry cutter as if you were making pie crust. I have never made a pie crust so for those confused as I was, simply add the butter gradually, and piece it up with your fork until you have pea-sized amounts in the mixture.
- 4. Add the milk, eggs, and yeast mixture to the dry ingredients.
- 5. Mix well (by hand) and knead a few times until you've got a round ball of dough.
- Cover bowl and refrigerate overnight (important, you need to keep the dough chilled so overnight is perfect!)
- 7. When ready to bake, preheat the oven to 350°F. Divide dough into 6 parts, keeping one part out and putting the rest back in the fridge until ready for it.
- B. Scatter your counter generously with sugar and cinnamon, and roll each piece into a circle on the sugar. I used a tea saucer placed on top and cut around it to create the perfect circle.
- 9. Cut your circle into wedges like a pie. I cut mine into 4 pieces and then cut each in half so I ended up with 8 wedges from each circle.
- 10. Roll each wedge from the widest side inward to the skinniest.
- 11. Place on a baking sheet about 1 inch apart and bake for 10 minutes, or until golden.
- 12. Remove from baking sheet immediately and cool.

After decades of pushing for this moment, family and supporters of the late Herb Carnegie felt Herb Carnegie felt at peace.

Carnegie finally gets due, named to Hockey Hall of Fame Class ...

Herb Carnegie's daughter Bernice, spoke of her late father who several hockey historians regard as the best Black player never to play the NHL and a pioneer on and off the ice, was finally elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in the Builder category.

Honoured Posthumously

Herb Carnegie is regularly considered the best Black hockey player to never play in the NHL Born in Toronto, Ontario on November 8, 1919, Herb grew up listening to 'Hockey Night in Canada,' dreaming of one day following his Toronto Maple Leafs heroes to the NHL. But as the son of Jamaican immigrants, the path was strewn with challenges for the young man. After honing his skating skills on the frozen ponds of North York, Ontario with his brother Ossie, Herb went on to excel playing hockey with his school. There, he was spotted by Ed Wildey of the Toronto Young Rangers, a Junior 'A' franchise in the Ontario Hockey Association.

Young Rangers played their home games at Maple Leaf Gardens, and were given practice time at that arena every weekday morning at 6am. One morning in 1938, Carnegie's coach pulled him aside. "See that man up there?" he allegedly asked Carnegie, pointing to a man sitting in the stands watching the practice. "That's Conn Smythe, owner of the Maple Leafs. He says he'll give \$10,000 to anyone who can turn Herb Carnegie white."
